

Medical/Immunization Information
for Kindergarten Roundup 2009

Dear Parent(s) or Guardian(s):

The State of Indiana has mandated the requirements below for incoming students.

1. All students are required to be immunized against diphtheria, whooping cough, tetanus, polio, measles, rubella and mumps, chickenpox and hepatitis B. The number of immunizations needed are as follows:
DPT (Diphtheria, Pertussis (whooping cough) and tetanus) - 5
Polio - 4
MMR (measles, mumps and rubella) - 2
Varacella (chickenpox) - 1 *or proof of disease*
Hepatitis B - 3
2. Someone in your doctor's office must record all immunizations given to your child since birth on the form provided from the school for the school's permanent records by the first day of school.
3. Exceptions may be given for the following:
 - a. Doctor stating in writing that vaccine(s) are medically inadvisable.
 - b. Written statement of religious or other serious objection.
4. No child will be permitted to attend school for more than 20 days beyond the beginning date of the school year unless:
 - a. he or she is fully immunized.
 - b. he or she has begun immunizations and parent/guardian has a signed completion schedule from doctor.
5. If your child is unable to receive immunizations from a doctor, the following places are available with minimal or no fee:

To receive immunizations, a record of the dates of all previous immunizations MUST accompany the child. If any adult other than the parent or guardian brings the child for shots, they must have WRITTEN PERMISSION from the parent or guardian. The note should include name(s) of parent/guardian(s), child and adult accompanying the child, as well as the clinic date.

Kindergarten booster shots are given at age 4 to 6 years. The 2nd MMR and HEP-B series are given to children through 18 years of age. This requires a complete shot record with proper adult permission.
